


Georges Seurat, A Sunday on the Grande-Jatte--1884, 1884-86 fuse Impressionism and old masters (academic) to make solid the disintegrating forms of impressionism Pierre-Auguste Renoir, Path in the Woods, circa 1874-1877

Reminder: disintegrating form

color/light > mass and volume

but also cropping and diagonal composition





"old master"

balanced comp emphasis on figures planar organization of figures












color theory applied methodically:

analyzes proportions of a tint/tone/shade and separate it into colors of the spectrum.

Then applied the colors as "dots" so that with optical blending would produce the tint/tone/shade AND a degree of vibration.

Intensities increased by simultaneous presence of complementary colors (blueorange/green-red)


